

SESSION

Next Meeting: June 25 7PM



The Elders met via Zoom on Thursday May 28, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. Rev. Jennifer Olson served as moderator. The Session approved Shar Hulstein to serve as Duane Mullen's Session liaison. The Session unanimously voted to endorse Duane Mullen's request to enroll as a Candidate in the process toward ordination as a Minister of Word and Sacrament. On June 1st, Duane will be evaluated by the Committee on Preparation for Ministry, and if advancement is recommended by the committee, the Presbytery will vote to accept the recommendation of the CPM at its June 6, 2020 meeting.

The Session voted to keep the church building closed and continue online worship services. To comply with insurance company recommendations to document all ways that we are keeping the congregation and church building safe, the Session also voted to have a sign-in sheet at the entryways for all persons entering the

building. This is to also ensures that all areas accessed in the building are cleaned and sanitized. All persons entering the building will be required to wear a mask to prevent the potential spread of COVID-19.

The Finance Committee reported that the church was awarded the Presbytery's COVID-19 Technology Grant of \$1500 for updating our church website. A meeting will be held with local website designer, Pam Jacobsen of PPP Design, (a local website designer) to get started.

In an effort to reach other to our congregations and the community during this time of separation, Pastor Jenn and Pastor Mike Fillmore from the Methodist Church are planning to work together to offer at-home communion packs to both congregations (and others in the community) on Sunday, June 7. Eric Olson will bake individual loaves of bread; the Methodist Church will provide grape juice. Our Worship Committee will be working on a plan to distribute and/or deliver communion packs to all church families. We will also advertise on our church's Facebook page and Crawford Cares Facebook page if anyone in the community wants to join in. Everyone is invited to share in our communion service online at 10:30 am.

BOARD OF DEACONS

Deacons met via email in May following consensus that a formal meeting was unnecessary at this time. Several email messages, questions, and sharings of information were sent, received, and communicated to keep in touch. Deacons continue assisting in the community as a need is seen, praying for others, and reaching out within the parameters of social distancing and safety considerations.

The Church Building Remains Closed!

At our May Session meeting, your elders voted 8-1 to keep the church building closed, continuing with online worship services. Dr. RoseMary Mason gave an update on the latest information about COVID-19 and Pastor Jennifer shared information from the Presbytery about keeping our congregations safe. While we all sorely miss our Sunday worship services together – and maybe some of us even miss those committee meetings in person – it is the strong desire of the Session to err on the side of caution and safety. Not enough is known at this time about transmission of COVID-19. As things continue to remain uncertain, we are staying updated on what new information is coming out from the CDC, Iowa Department of Public Health, The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) the case count in our area, and guidelines from our Presbytery.

New Church Building Restrictions

Beginning May 29, everyone who enters the church building is required to sign in and out and to wear a mask while in the building. The church insurance company has recommended documenting everything we do to protect the congregation. We ask that you only come inside the building for essential purposes. Thank you!

GOOD MEASURE

In Luke 6:32-38, Jesus said "Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you." What point was Jesus making? It can be tempting to hear this and focus on what we get out of giving, but doing so would miss the point. Jesus preceded that statement with this one: "Love your enemies, do good to them, and lend to them without expecting to get anything back. Then your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High, because he is kind to the ungrateful and wicked." We don't give to get things; we give because God delights in our generosity. Our love for others reflects His loving heart toward us. In what ways have you experienced God's generosity in your life? How can you extend generosity to others? (by Remi Oyedele in *Our Daily Bread* devotional for May 28.)

When Daryl and I read that yesterday morning, I was prompted to think of stewardship at United Presbyterian. During this time while we are not physically meeting in our church building, we are still the church. Yet our offerings have been decreasing. Perhaps because of individual financial

challenges. Perhaps because it is no longer convenient to drop something in the offering plate while the organist plays the offertory. 


