PASTOR'S PONDERINGS ...

The season of Lent has officially begun. Every year, I enter it in a different frame of mind. Some years I've enthusiastically made intentions to give up something, such as Diet Coke, or chocolate some years ago. Other times I've struggled to come up with a meaningful Lenten practice. I've tried adding extra daily prayer and silent meditation and reading scripture. (Because as a pastor and spiritual leader, those are things I need to be doing already). For Eric and me, Lent begins with his surgery to remove his right kidney which has a small, cancerous tumor on it. That's a lot to "give up" for Lent! I expect our focus for the next six weeks will be on healing and recovery from the surgery.

However, the Big Question is "Where is God in all of this?" The quick answer is, "God is right there, alongside us, in the midst of the muck and the ordinary." But it's not always clear and easy to see how God is working in our lives and in the world. So often lately, I read the news and just shake my head in wonderment. How did we get to this place of such hatred and vitriol and anger at one another? The world seems a fearful place right now, with influenza and the novel coronavirus threats. And yet, something like facing your own everyday problems, such as having surgery, makes the world seem a whole lot smaller, with concern for my loved ones, family, and congregation.

I love the invitation to a Holy Lent that calls us to a season of looking at ourselves and making amends for the wrongs we've done; for prayer and fasting (yes, I do this. You might find it to be a helpful practice on occasion. Try not eating from sun-up to sundown and observe how you feel when you can't reach out for something to eat). Do acts of love and kindness. Maybe you could choose someone each day to give some extra kindness to. And meditate on God's word. A simple thing to do is read a psalm each day.

I pray that your Lent will be a time of deepening your faith and seeing God at work in your life.

The meeting adjourned and was closed with the Lord's Prayer. The next Deacon meeting will be on March 3, 2020.




